ASM LeMay presented the subject recommendation. ASM LeMay stated each year

CA Code §7910 requires the District to establish an Appropriations Limit at the beginning of each fiscal year. Fiscal Year 2008 appropriations limit has been calculated at \$54 million dollars.

GM Bushee introduced CPA Richard Duffey who provided an overview of the Updated Worksheets from the 2004 Financial Plan Update. CPA Duffey reviewed the financial worksheets from the past three years.

G. Review and Discuss the Technical Alternatives for LWD Recycled Water Program Asset Management Planning.





Leucadia Wastewater District Revenue FY 2006-2007



Leucadia Wastewater District Operating Expenses FY 2006-2007








RECOMMENDATION:

Staff recommends that the Board of Directors:

1. Authorize the General Manager to execute an agreement with West Coast Underground for the Piraeus Pipeline Repair in an amount not to exceed \$31,500.

2. Discuss and take other action as appropriate.

DISCUSSION:

The Engineering Committee is scheduled to review this item at its July 9, 2007. If the EC suggests any modifications to this recommendation, staff will report those modifications to the Board as appropriate.

During routine Closed Circuit Television (CCTV) inspection, staff discovered a section of line that has deflected severely and requires excavation and resetting. The line is located in a private easement just to the east of Piraeus Road in Encinitas (see attached map). The close proximity of the surrounding residences and a concrete storm water channel within the 15' easement complicate this repair. LWD records show that the line was constructed around 1967 and repaired some time around 1988.

Infrastructure Engineering Corporation (IEC) has completed the design for the repair and the estimated construction cost is \$40,000. Due to the relatively low construction cost estimate, the General Manager opted not to conduct a sealed bid process but, rather, to exercise an exception to the sealed bid as prescribed under Section 11.3B of LWD's Procurement Policy. Section 11.3B allows the General Manager to forgo the sealed process if it is unlikely there will be any economic benefits to be gained. Due to the low cost it was unlikely firms would be willing to go through the effort involved with submitting sealed bids. Instead, staff followed the Procurement Policy's, Informal Procurement Process, for goods where quotes were solicited from four known construction firms.

Accordingly, staff developed and distributed a Request for Quotes (Quote) to Filanc Construction Company, Hubbard Construction, West Coast Underground, and TC Construction Company. Bids were received from three construction firms in the following amounts:

2. Discuss and take other action as appropriate.

DISCUSSION:

An election will soon be held to elect a Director for CSDA's Region 6, Seat B. Regarding this election, LWD has received correspondence from Ms. Arlene Schafer and the South Bav Irrigation District. The purpose of this agenda item is to present the correspondence for the Board's consideration.

On June 20, 2007, the District received a letter from Ms. Arlene Schafer requesting the Board's vote and support to enable her to continue on the CSDA Board of Directors. Ms. Schafer, a current CSDA board member from Costa Mesa Sanitary District, is running for re-election in Region 6.

Ms. Schafer's letter indicates that she has served as CSDA Board of Director's Treasurer and Secretary as well as Vice-President of the Finance Corporation. She has also served on CSDA's Legislative Committee and as Membership Recruitment Chair. Other relevant experience includes: Mayor of the City of Costa Mesa; Planning Commissioner; Executive Manager of the Chamber of Commerce; and, as past President of the Independent Special Districts of Orange County. Overall, her letter (Attachment 1) indicates that she is well qualified for this position.

Ann Kulchin, Wife, Mother, Grandmother, Councilwoman


