SUBJECT:	Achievement of Organizational Performance Objective

I am pleased to report that the Leucadia Wastewater District (LWD) recently achieved an organizational objective under the District's Incentive Program.

#### Cost Sharing of CSRMA Retrospective Refunds or Dividends

At its January 2020 meeting, the CSRMA Board of Directors approved the distribution of dividend payments from the pooled liability insurance program to LWD in the amount of \$27,022.00 (see attached letter). The dividend reflects LWD's excellent risk management record and an ongoing commitment to safety. This meets an organizational objective under LWD's Incentive Program which authorizes a 50% cost sharing of the dividend amount with employees. Consequently, each employee is eligible for an incentive compensation award of \$711.11. Table 1, below, summarizes the allocation of the CSRMA dividend and calculation of this incentive compensation award.

#### Pooled Liability Program Twenty-Eighth Dividend Declaration

Dear Paul:

On January 22, 2020, in accordance with the Board adopted Policy and Procedure, the Board of Directors declared a dividend. Dividends declared reflect favorable results from Program Years 1986/87 - 2013/14. Enclosed is Leucadia Wastewater District's dividend share in the amount of \$27,022.

All agencies share in dividends through the formula adopted by the Board of Directors. Dividends are in addition to the Retrospective Rating Program, which limits returns to 25% of a member's original deposit. Any remaining unencumbered funds up to 25% of the amount in any one year are shared among the membership as dividends.

This year, our 34th year of providing service to our membership, the total amount of the dividend declared is \$1,292,953. This remarkable result is reflective of a continued effort in *effective risk management* by member agencies, as well as through the hard work of the CSRMA claims management staff, Program Committee, and the Executive Board.

We expect to declare dividends again next year, the calculation of which will incorporate all prior program years including 2014/15. Overall, the Pooled Liability Program has returned over \$25 million in dividends since its inception, giving a clear indication that the program continues to remain fiscally healthy and is meeting the needs of the membership.

FST II Easton presented the item noting it is a tactical goal for Fiscal Year 2020. He provided background information on the vehicles and stated that both vehicles have reached their useful life and meet or exceed the District's vehicle replacement guidelines.

FST II Easton stated that only one bid was received from Encinitas Ford. He stated that staff determined that Encinitas Ford met all required bid specifications and was the lowest responsive and responsible bidder.

The Board thanked FST II Easton for his presentation.

#### 19. Contract Award for the District's Leucadia Pump Station Rehabilitation Project

Authorize the General Manager to execute an Agreement with Stanek Contractors, Incorporated for the construction of the Leucadia Pump Station Rehabilitation Project in an amount not to exceed \$3,551,500 as the lowest responsive and responsible bidder.

TSM Morishita presented the item noting it is a tactical goal for Fiscal Year 2020. He provided background information on the project noting that project design was completed by Infrastructure Engineering Corporation (IEC) in November 2019 and the project was advertised for bids. TSM Morishita said that the bids were due on January 16, 2020 and seven bids were received.

TSM Morishita explained that the low bidder, HPS Mechanical Inc. (HPS), did not meet the minimum bid requirements and, therefore, their bid was nonresponsive. Stanek Constructors, Inc. (Stanek), the second lowest bidder did meet all the bid requirements and was considered the lowest responsive and responsible bidder. TSM Morishita explained that Stanek's bid is \$109K higher than HPS's bid and that both bids were under the \$3.7M Engineer's Cost Estimate for construction.

Following discussion, upon a motion duly made by Director Sullivan, seconded by Director Hanson, and unanimously carried, the Board of Directors authorized the General Manager to execute an Agreement with Stanek Contractors, Incorporated for the construction of the Leucadia Pump Station Rehabilitation Project in an amount not to exceed \$3,551,500 as the lowest responsive and responsible bidder by the following vote:

Subsequently, the two remaining manholes at the

end of the B3 Force Main can now be lined. This will take place March 5, 2020 at which time the project will be complete.

#### 7. General Manager's Comments

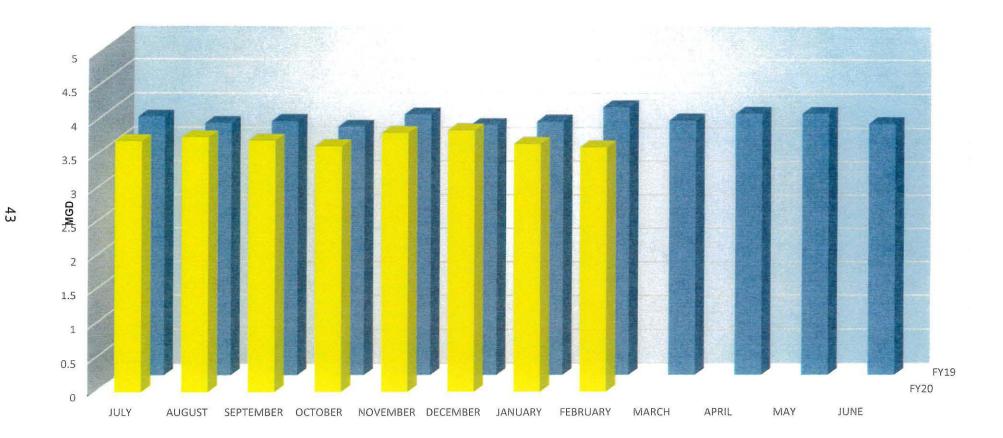

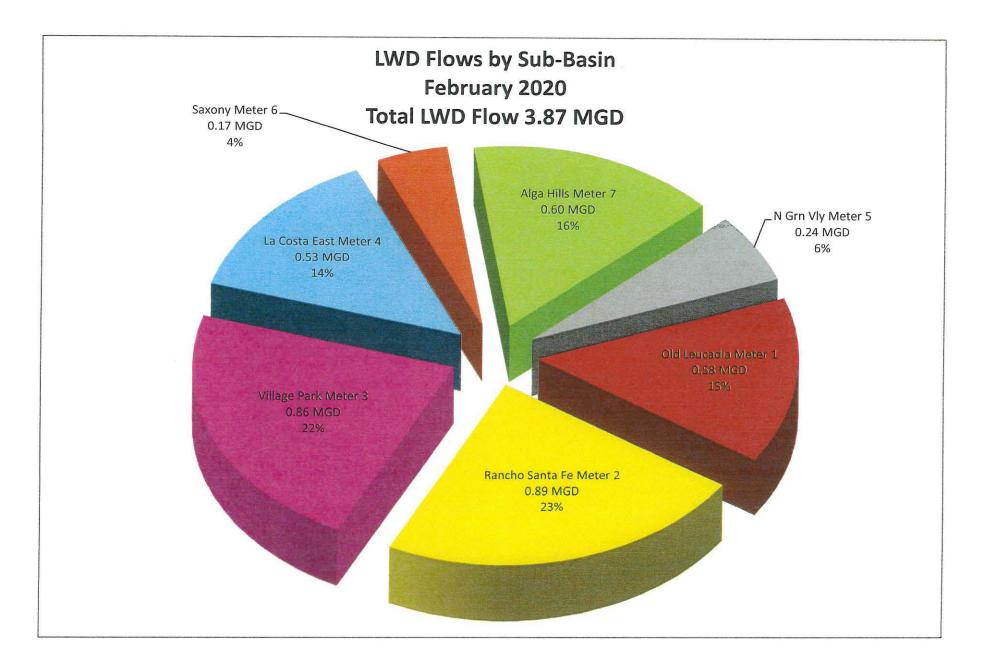

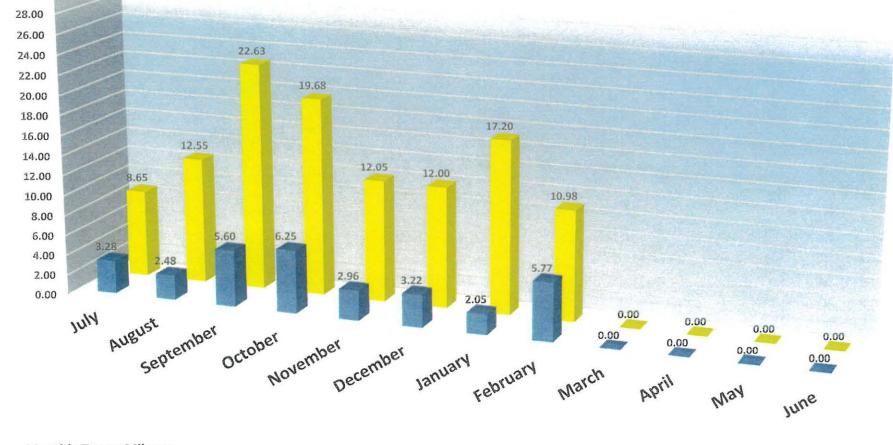
Leucadia Wastewater District Flow Comparison FY19 to FY20

# FY-20 CCTV Inspections & Hydro Cleaning Production



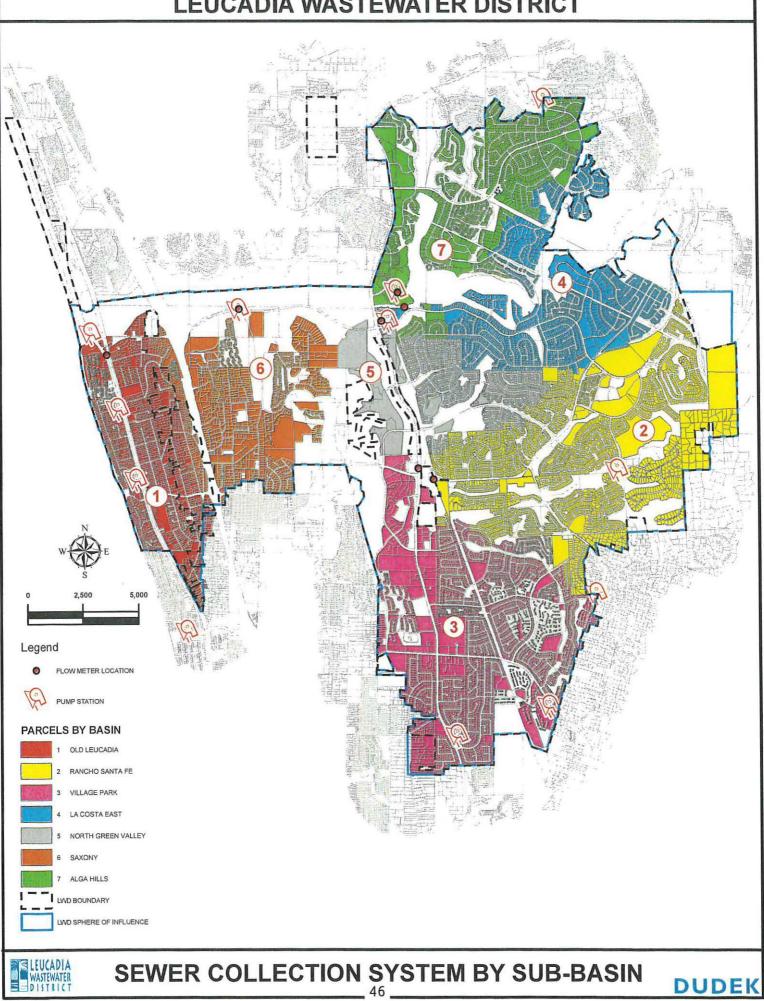

The Elections and Bylaws Committee is looking for Independent Special District Board Members or their General Managers who are interested in leading the direction of the California Special Districts Association for the 2021 - 2023 term.

The leadership of CSDA is elected from its six geographical networks. Each of the six networks has three seats on the Board with staggered 3-year terms. Candidates must be affiliated with an independent special district that is a CSDA Regular Member in good standing and located within the geographic network that they seek to represent. The CSDA Board of Directors is the governing body responsible for all policy decisions related to CSDA's member services, legislative advocacy, education and resources. The Board of Directors is crucial to the operation of the Association and to the representation of the common interests of all California's special districts before the Legislature and the State Administration. Serving on the Board requires one's interest in the issues confronting special districts statewide.

### **Commitment and Expectations:**

- Attend all Board meetings, usually 4-5 meetings annually, at the CSDA office in Sacramento.
- Participate on at least one committee, meets 3-5 times a year at the CSDA office in Sacramento. (CSDA reimburses Directors for their related expenses for Board and committee meetings as outlined in Board policy).
- Attend, at minimum, the following CSDA annual events: Special Districts Legislative Days held in the spring, and the CSDA Annual Conference held in the fall.

(CSDA does **not** reimburse expenses for the two conferences even if a Board or committee meeting is held in conjunction with the event, however does comp registration for the two events)

• Complete all four modules of CSDA's Special District Leadership Academy within 2 years of being elected.

(CSDA does **not** reimburse expenses for the Academy classes even if a Board or committee meeting is held in conjunction with the event).

Complete Annual Chief Executive Officer Evaluation.

Nomination Procedures: Any Regular Member in good standing is eligible to nominate one person, a board member or managerial employee (as defined by that district's Board of Directors), for election to the CSDA Board of Directors. A copy of the member district's resolution or minute action and Candidate Information Sheet must accompany the nomination. The deadline for receiving nominations is <u>March 26,</u> <u>2020.</u> Nominations and supporting documentation may be mailed, faxed, or emailed.

The successful candidates will be notified no later than July 14, 2020. All selected Board Members will be introduced at the Annual Conference in Palm Desert, CA in August 2020.

The successful candidates will be notified no later than July 14, 2020. All selected Board Members will be introduced at the Annual Conference in Palm Desert, CA in August 2020.



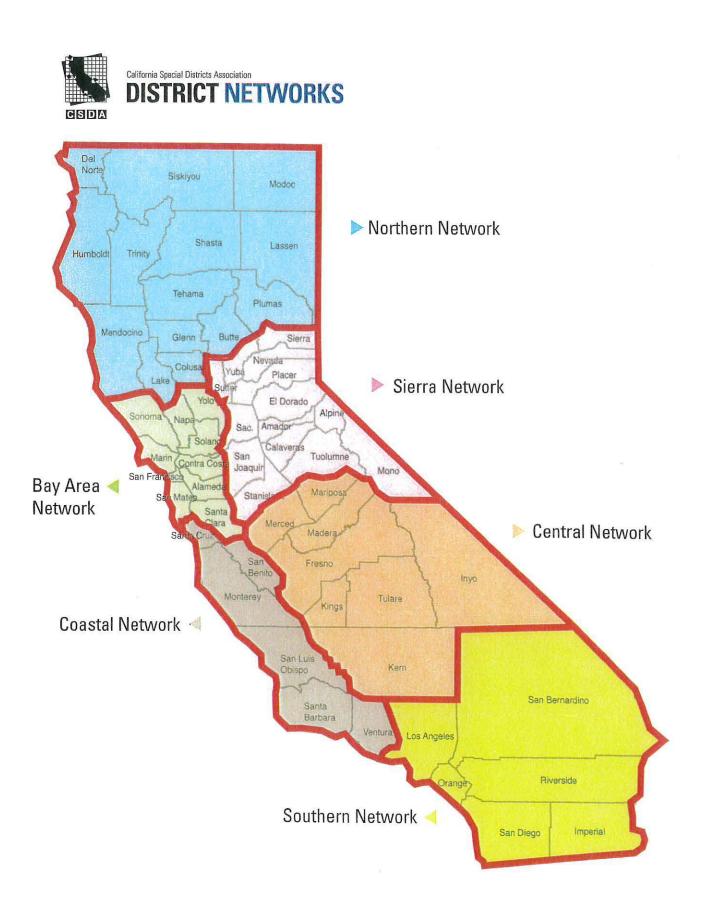
